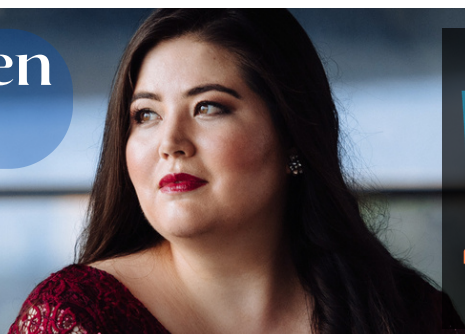

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Japanese-American soprano **Emily Michiko Jensen** has been praised for her “theatrical instincts and intriguingly versatile instrument.”

This season, Ms. Jensen returns to **Hawai'i Opera Theatre** for the world premiere of *TEA* as Teruko Mackenzie. She also returns to **Florentine Opera** to reprise the role of First Lady/Erste Dame in their production of *Die Zauberflöte*.

Last season, Ms. Jensen was a 2025-2026 Artist in Residence at **Opera San José** where she made two dream role debuts: Fiordiligi (*Così fan tutte*) and Cio-Cio san (*Madama Butterfly*). She also joined two workshops for the world premiere of *Solaris* by Cwik & Asaro produced and commissioned by **Opera San José**.

In spring 2025, Ms. Jensen returned to the **Opera Company of Middlebury** to sing Mimi (*La bohème*). She was a guest artist on VermontPublic Radio during her time with OCM. Prior to joining the production, she was a semi-finalist for the **2025 Jensen Foundation Vocal Competition**.

Ms. Jensen is an alumna of the Emerging Artists program (2023-2024) at **Boston Lyric Opera**, where she covered the title role in their new production of *Madama Butterfly* and performed as a guest artist for the Orfeo Society & Goldovsky Society gala. During the program, she was featured on Episode 3 of “Getting

Into Opera,” a WGBH series co-produced by **Boston Lyric Opera & New England Conservatory** showcasing a Master Class with Patricia Racette. In preparation for her season with **BLO**, Ms. Jensen received a Career Grant from **The Olga Forrai Foundation**.

In the spring 2024, Ms. Jensen made role and house debuts with **Hawai'i Opera Theatre** as Mimi (*La bohème*) and **La Frontera Opera at Borderland Arts Foundation** as Musetta (*La bohème*).

In the summer 2022 season, she returned to **Chautauqua Opera** as an Apprentice Artist to cover the title role of *Tosca*. She also sang Angel More and covered Susan B. Anthony in *The Mother of Us All*. At the end of the season, she participated in the Workshop of *The House on Mango Street* (Bermel/Cisneros) as Cathy, Queen of Cats. During the 2021-2022 season, she made her **Florentine Opera** debut as Jessie in Weill's *Mahagonny: Ein Songspiel*. She began that season by joining **Pensacola Opera** as an Artist in Residence to sing First Lady and cover Pamina in *Die Zauberflöte*, cover Berta in *Il barbiere di Siviglia*, and perform Wagner's *Die Wesendonck lieder* at the Opera Center in their Liederabend series.

In the 2020-2021 season, Ms. Jensen was slated to join **Florentine Opera** to perform Maguelonne and cover the title role in Viardot's *Cendrillon*, sing Countess Ceprano in *Rigoletto*, and cover Mimi in *La bohème* (COVID19). During the pandemic, she joined the **Opera Company of Middlebury** as the soprano soloist/ensemble in a virtual opera production of Michael Ching's *Completing the Picture*, and made her role debut as the titular role of *Suor Angelica* at the **Indiana University Opera Theatre**. In 2019-2020, she returned to the **Boston Opera Collaborative** to sing Donna Anna in *Don Giovanni*.

In past seasons, Ms. Jensen enjoyed two consecutive summers with **Chautauqua Opera** as a Studio Artist. While with the company, she covered the role of Soprano 2 in *Hydrogen Jukebox*, sang the role of 2nd Soprano in Missy Mazzoli's *Song from the Uproar* and covered Annina in *La traviata* with Maestro Steven Osgood. She also served as an Apprentice Artist with **Sarasota Opera**, and made her professional debut with the **Boston Opera Collaborative** as Marguerite in *Faust* in 2016.

A veteran in the competition circuit, Ms. Jensen was named a finalist in the 2018 McCammon competition. During the 2022 season, she was a semi-finalist in Opera San José's Irene Dalis Vocal Competition, the Gerda Lissner International Vocal Competition, and the Annapolis Opera Competition.

Ms. Jensen was a recipient of the esteemed Georgina Joshi International Fellowship from **Indiana University** while a Performance Diploma candidate with an Associate Instructor scholarship & stipend. She holds a Graduate Diploma & MM in Vocal Performance from **New England Conservatory** and a Bachelor of Music in Vocal Performance from the **Eastman School of Music**.

Her rolling, butterscotch-gold soprano transitioned seamlessly through the registers.. Her reading of the show’s most popular hit tune, “Ah! je ris de me voir si belle en ce miroir” (the Jewel Song) perfectly encapsulated the merits of her performance as a whole. Her comic hypocrisy was perfectly judged, as Marguerite speaks of her modesty and hesitation at wearing the rich ornaments left at her doorstep, all the while diving into the jewel box with rapacious delight. Her already lovely sound blossomed and unfolded over the course of the piece; At her weakest, Jensen was merely excellent; at her best, she was superb.”
